GE	Introduction	paragraph 5	ge	The development of a quality management system for solid recovered fuels based on this TS does not involve a compulsory third party certification , however this certification is recommended .	<p>To the NGOs' opinion, a certification by a third party is compulsory, especially with regard to prevent fraud when quantifying the biomass content using the selective dissolution method, see document TC 343 WI .10:2005 (E), chapter 6.2:</p> <p>"In case of a mixture between solid fossil fuels and solid recovered fuels, the biomass content shall be determined before they are mixed, or duly documented. Materials of fossil origin may wrongly be detected as biomass, materials like lignite and peat could be added in order to obtain an increase in the values for biomass content of a solid recovered fuel. This obviously interferes with the results and results in to results that are no longer valid. For more information see the technical specifications on quality assurance see prCEN/TS (WI 00343002)."</p> <p>The same is true for specifications and classes, see document prCEN/TS 15359:2005 (E), chapter 8.1:</p> <p>" For a considered 12 months period, for each property specified in the classification system, the compliance of a particular SRF shall be established by demonstration that the measured properties conform to the limit values defined for that class. This shall be performed at a period in which a quality management system (QMS) is applied. The lot size for classification shall be one tenth of a 12 months rolling period of production of the fuel to be classified. "</p>
